# Salt River District Merit Badge Advancement Day December 1, 2012

## Instructions for Scouts

1. Select one or two merit badges that you would like to prepare for.
2. Obtain an "Application for Merit Badge" (blue card) form No. 634124 for each merit badge you choose and fill in the required information.
3. Return the cards to your unit leader for approval. There is a \$1.00 fee to cover expenses of the event depending on your unit's bylaws; the fee will either be paid by yourself or by your unit.
4. Obtain and study the merit badge books. Complete all of the requirements listed in the prerequisites section of this advancement day packet for the merit badges you have chosen.
5. On Advancement Day, bring your merit badge books, notepad, pen, completed prerequisites, merit badge applications (blue cards), and any additional materials you have prepared. Counselors will not sign off prerequisite requirements that have not been completed or brought with you on Advancement Day.
6. Wear your scout uniform – clean, buttoned up, and neatly tucked in.

### General Information

- At least one responsible adult representing your unit must be in attendance on Advancement Day.
- The Scout Oath and Law are the conduct guidelines at all scout activities. If a scout's behavior becomes disruptive or inappropriate, he will be asked to call his parents to be picked up. He will not be able to continue with the remaining merit badge sessions for that day.
- There is a \$1.00 fee per Scout to cover printing, postage, and miscellaneous expenses. Fees are not refundable, but are transferable.

### Registration Information

- Registration deadline for guaranteed space is November 19, 2012. Registrations received thereafter will be processed on a space available basis. Limited classes will be filled on a "first come basis". No registrations will be processed less than four days prior to the event. Auto Maintenance is limited to the first 10 scouts.
  - Registration is considered received when both the registration form and payment have been received.
  - Scouts can register for a maximum of two merit badges. Note that some merit badges require both sessions.

# 2013 National Scout Jamboree

## July 5 – July 25, 2013

Boston Tour – This tour will begin in Boston, with visits to New York City, Philadelphia/Gettysburg and Washington D.C. prior to the National Jamboree.

**Council Contingent:**

The Grand Canyon Council will take a contingent of 9 Troops with 36 youth and 4 adult leaders in each Troop. Seven troops are designated to tour the Northeast for 10 days prior to the National Jamboree. Two Troops will tour only the Washington D.C. area prior to the National Jamboree.

**Qualification for Scouts:**

- Be at least First Class at the time of attendance at the Jamboree
- Have completed sixth grade or be at least 12-years-old by July 1, 2013 and have not reached his 18th birthday by July 24, 2013.
- Participate in all pre-jamboree training experiences.
- Submit a Jamboree Medical Form.
- Be approved by his local unit leader and the Grand Canyon Council Jamboree committee.

**Financial Details For This Tour Package:**

Reserve your place now with a \$350 Non-Refundable Application Deposit. The Jamboree fee for the tour is \$3,500 per Scout. This fee includes all transportation, tours, admission fees, meals, lodging, special patches, neckerchief, most patrol and Troop equipment, and a Jamboree Training weekend. A payment schedule and contract is attached, with installments due beginning April 1, 2011, and the final payment due NO LATER than April 10, 2013.

**Additional Costs to Consider:**

Please be aware that there are always additional expenses to consider that are not part of the above Jamboree fee. Additional expenses might include: troop committee expenses, which are determined by each troop, spending money for snacks and souvenirs on the tour, personal equipment and uniforms (the new "centennial" uniform is required). These additional costs may be \$300 - \$400, or more, and are the responsibility of the participant and his family.
